Changes to permissions in the waste and resource recovery sector

Waste resource recovery changes

The commencement of the *Environment Protection Act 2017* (the Act), from 1 July 2021, includes important changes that waste and resource recovery facilities need to comply with to operate legally.

The Act introduces new environmental protections. The **general environmental duty (GED)** is at the centre of the new Act and it applies to all Victorians. The GED requires you to minimise the risk of your activities harming the environment or human health, so far as **reasonably practicable**. Under the new laws, to perform a prescribed activity that may cause harm to human health and the environment, you must have a permission from EPA such as a **licence**, **permit** or **registration**. Your permission will have conditions attached, which will compliment your obligations to comply with the GED and will focus on the key risks of the prescribed activity.

Permissions for waste and resource recovery facilities

Depending on the size of your waste and resource recovery facility and the type of material you receive, you may now need a permission from EPA.

If you don't have a current licence or permit for your waste and resource recovery facility and your activity belongs to one of the following categories, you need to apply for a permission from 1 July 2021 and before October 2021 (or 2 January 2022 for registrations).

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How to apply for a permission

Apply for your new permission to comply with the new environment protection laws, by signing up to our new **EPA Portal** (https://www.epa.vic.gov.au/portal) from 27 May 2021.

Once you are signed up, apply for your permission from 1 July 2021.

Applications for a licence or permit will require you to provide details of your business, the activities you conduct on the site and evidence demonstrating how you have assessed and are managing risks to the environment and human health posed by your activity. You will also need to provide evidence that you meet EPA's requirements as a suitable person to hold a permission (fit and proper person).

Registrations only require you to provide details of your business and the activities you conduct on the site. For further application information and support, visit the <u>EPA website</u> (https://www.epa.vic.gov.au/for-business/new-laws-and-your-business/permissions).

Key dates

From 27 May 2021:

Get ready to apply for your new licence, permit or registration by signing up to our new EPA Portal.

From 1 July 2021:

- Licences and permits must be applied for between 1 July 2021 and October 2021.
- If your activity needs a registration, you must apply before
 2 January 2022.

What to do if you already have a permission

If you have an existing permission that is current, it will automatically transition when the new Act comes into effect on 1 July 2021. You will receive a notice of amendment from EPA on 1 July that will bring your existing permission into alignment with the new laws. The Environment Protection Regulations 2021 include some changes to fees and permission types, with fees under the current Act continuing to apply until 1 July 2021.
